

# Alegría Musical— Latin American Stories

Grades K-3



Extend student learning with inperson or remote sessions led by accomplished teaching artists. Learning resource sites create curricular connections and provide additional material for both classroom teachers and students.

In Alegría Musical, students will explore musical traditions from Mexico, Cuba, the Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, and Venezuela through songs, stories, and plenty of rhythm. Students will develop general musical skills through body percussion, rhythm exercises, and interactive musical activities while also learning about Fandango, Rumba, Calypso, Plena, Chacarera and Merengue.
